MINIMUM QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Individual must pass urinalysis, **pass service-specific military physical fitness test and height and weight standards**, complete a PHA or equivalent (medically qualified for active duty assignment).
- Must have basic computer skills (email, PowerPoint, Word).
- Must have initiative and the ability to work independently, as well as part of a team.
- Must possess skills related to writing, organization, flexibility, time management, and problem solving.
- Must possess a valid driver's license and reliable transportation.
- Must have good verbal and written communication skills.
- Must have a minimum of 500 flight hours, previous pilot in command designation preferred.
- Previous Counterdrug experience preferred.
- Must be UH-72 qualified.

MILITARY REQUIREMENTS:

- Counterdrug (FTNGDCD) tour from approximately **01 May 2025 until 30 September 2025**. Subject to availability of funds.
- Tours may be continued depending on the availability of funding, member's performance, and our customers' needs. Urinalysis testing is required upon entry to active duty, and personnel are subject to periodic testing while on active duty. These requirements are in addition to testing by units of assignment during IDT/IAD under the JNGSAP.
- While on FTNGDCD orders, individual must maintain satisfactory military membership (i.e., inactive duty training, annual training) with their unit of assignment.
- Criminal records checks are conducted on all applicants, and a security screening may be required by supported agencies. Unfavorable results may lead to non-selection or removal from the CJTF.
- National Guard members participating in the Counterdrug Support Program are required to comply with state laws and with DoD 5500.7-R. Members are required to uphold the highest standards of conduct and personal appearance. Outside employment, associations and off-duty conduct/activities must be consistent with federal directives on ethics and with state and federal conflict of interest policies. Outside employment will require written approval of CDC according to para 8-25 of this regulation.
- The location of the member's unit of assignment must be within a reasonable commuting distance from the assigned Counterdrug duty station, or the member's home of record.

Equal Opportunity: Consideration for placement and evaluation of qualification will be made on a fair and equitable basis without regard to race, religion, color, lawful political affiliation, marital status, sex, or national origin.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:

- Perform aerial reconnaissance/observation of suspected narcotics manufacturing, trafficking, and distribution areas.
- Utilize S&S BN aircraft-specific equipment such as “Nightsun”, “Wolfsburg”, and MX15i as an aerial C&C platform for high-risk narcotics operations.
- Report accurate and relevant details about mission to the supported DLEA.
- Inform CJTF-HQ of any pertinent changes in mission profile.
- BPT support all federal and state contingency operations.
- Maintain aircrew qualifications and aircraft in a high-state of readiness.
- Other duties as assigned.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Aviation aircrew members must possess the maturity and attitude to work long and flexible hours.
